In case someone is wondering that it hurts like hell for about 4 days, it hurts less for another 6 days or so and then casually for a couple of months. In a firstAs soon as he stood like crazy then I slowly started getting all the symptoms mentioned above. I rotated the ice and sodium bicarbonate on the bite and took all the painkillers I could easily. It wasn't pleasant. I ended up looking for a way to exterminate them from my garden. Now that spring is I have a lot for many for my comfort level with poisonous spiders.Deemarie13 October 2, 2018: I was bitten by a brown widow about an hour ago. Yeah, I identified it, and it's the egg bag. The site was immediately painful (like a wasp sting) and turned red. I live in the mountains, a long way from a hospital. I just made a poultice of baking soda, laundry soap and Crisco. After having roughitice for 15 minutes, the pain has stopped and the redness is decreasing. I will post again if you experience other symptoms. By the way, I am a (retired) combat doctor and I have all the doctors needed to treat anaphylaxis. I also have a husband I trained to use doctors.
